

REQUEST OF EXISTING DUTCH TAX REGISTRATION NUMBER FROM ABROAD

For Expats with financial interests in The Netherlands, it is good to know their Dutch tax registration number called 'BSN'. Among others, you need to have it in order to request a Dutch tax exemption when receiving pension terms from The Netherlands.

If you already have such a BSN but do not know the exact number, you can not ask the Dutch tax authority to just give it to you. You will have to send a letter including a copy of your passport to the following institution:

In your requesting letter please explain why you need the information called 'Uitreksel Basisregistratie Personen/BRP'.

It will take in general four weeks before you will receive the information plus an invoice of rounded € 25,-. There will be no charges if you require the information in relation to a pension fund and in that case please include the letter of the pension fund in order to prove this.
